THINGS TO DO DURING THE FIRST WEEK IN LITHUANIA

Bring Your Educational Documents

Each Student shall bring the original educational documents and their certified copies to the International Admissions Office (Address: Saulėtekio ave 9 III building, room 713A) within 2 weeks after their arrival to Lithuania and self-isolation (if applicable).

All documents issued in a language other than English, Lithuanian or Russian should be supplemented with an official translation to one of these languages (with the copies of it included).

A Mentor – ESNbuddy

Getting a mentor (ESNbuddy) is a good way for you to feel more at ease while settling in Lithuania, as well as beginning your studies. Your ESNbuddy will as well be one of your first friends here!

Health Insurance

All students should have health insurance valid in Lithuania that would cover medical expenses in case of an accident and illness during the stay.

European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) is valid **for EU citizens** in Lithuania.

Students from **non-EU countries** may obtain their health insurance either in their country of residence or in Lithuania. It costs approximately 15 EUR per month or more if you obtain it at a health insurance company in Lithuania.

Lithuanian Student Identity Card (LSIC or LSP)

All students of the University are required to obtain a **Lithuanian Student Identity Card (LSIC/LSP)** at the beginning of studies. The card is important because:

- it is necessary for getting access to the University library services;
- it is the best proof of your identity as a student at the University itself (especially while taking exams);
- it gives you various discounts at theatres, cinemas, and many other services and purchases;
- it gives you discounts for public transport in the biggest cities of Lithuania and travels between the cities and towns by buses or trains.

You may obtain your LSP by applying at www.lsp.lt: the whole application procedure is described on page 15 of this booklet.

Migration Issues

Visa D (for non-EU citizens)

All international degree students from non EU/EEA countries coming for studies to Lithuania are required to get national visa D. Visa D can only be issued for the period of up to 12 months and allows students to travel via Schengen area countries for up to 3 months (90 days) every 6 months.

Temporary Residence Permit (for non-EU citizens)

It takes up to 3 months for non EU citizens to get the temporary residence permit (TRP). Students must apply at least 4 months before expiration of the visa.

Please contact International Relations Office (IRO) concerning the required documents for TRP:

1. a mediation letter number (will be provided by IRO);
2. a confirmation of enrolment (prepared by the faculty);
3. an online application number (<https://www.migracija.lt/app/auth/login>);
4. a passport and its copy;
5. proofs of sufficient amount of subsistence funds (income/bank statement) (at least 3648 EUR);
6. a document concerning the place of residence in the Republic of Lithuania;*
7. a state fee of 120 € (general order)/240 € (urgent order);
8. a document confirming the legal stay in Lithuania (visa or TRP) and its copy;
9. a Certificate of Non-Criminal Record.**

*This document can be submitted upon receiving the notification from the Migration Department about the decision to issue a Temporary residence permit.

** Certificate of Non-Criminal Record should be issued not earlier than 6 months before the application for TRP. This docu-

ment should be translated into the Lithuanian or English language and **legalised or certified by affixing an Apostille.**

EU citizens - Registration in Lithuania

EU students, coming for the degree studies or a whole academic year, have to obtain the Certificate of EU national confirming their right to temporarily reside in Lithuania. For the registration at the Migration Office the following documents are necessary:

1. a valid passport (or ID card) and its copy;
2. a receipt of payment of 8,60 € fee (payment code 5740);
3. an online application number (<https://www.migracija.lt/app/auth/login>);
4. proofs of sufficient means of support (at least 125 € per month);
5. an EU medical insurance card or private insurance valid in Lithuania;
6. a confirmation of enrolment (prepared by the faculty).

Note: after the registration at the Migration office students have to declare their place of residence (at the Migration office or a local Municipality).

Please contact or come to IRO to ask for the preparation of necessary documents.

IMPORTANT: It is the responsibility of individual students to present all required documents in a timely manner at the Migration Department to maintain a valid and legitimate visa (or residence permit) status throughout their study at VU.

STUDENT SERVICES

Psychological Counselling

Vilnius University students can receive psychological help in VU Counseling and Training Centre.

University life can be stressful due to academic, financial, family or social pressures. These stressors can sometimes contribute to or exacerbate more significant psychological problems, such as depression, anxiety, substance abuse, trauma, or difficulties with sleeping, eating, studying, or attention.

The purpose of psychological counseling is to help people resolve, understand and deal with the personal or interpersonal issues related to psychological state and behavior. A psychologist can help recognize and change negative or irrational thoughts, to form positive view of self and others, help to cope with the feeling of helplessness and help to regain responsibility and self-control in life. Vilnius University students can receive up to 75 percent discount for the sessions.

Each student **is required to register** via the VU Identity Management System at <https://id.vu.lt> in order to be able to reach eServices provided by Vilnius University:

- **until the 13th of October** for students in Bachelor's and Integrated study programmes;
- **until the 30th of September** for students in Master's degree study programmes.

Students who fail to register online during the first month of studies shall be expelled from the University.

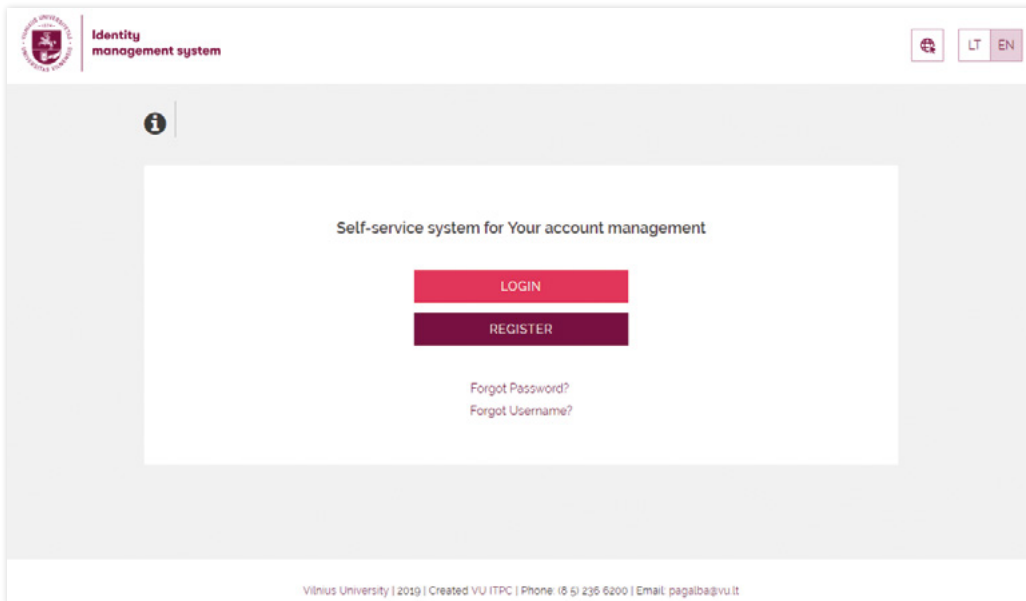

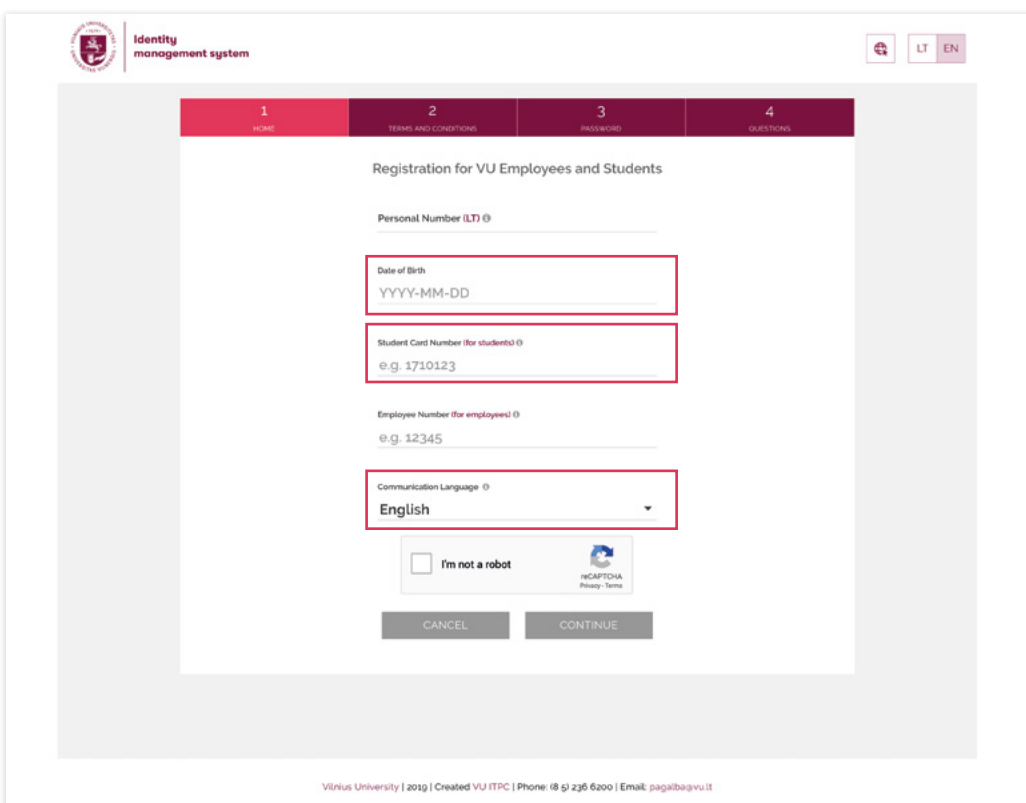
HOW TO REGISTER IN THE VU IDENTITY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

Step by step instructions:

1. Go to <https://id.vu.lt>
2. Switch to **ENGLISH** language on the top right corner
3. Click on **REGISTER:**



4. Type your **Date of Birth**, the **Student Card Number (LSP)**, that you must have received by email, and choose **Communication Language**:



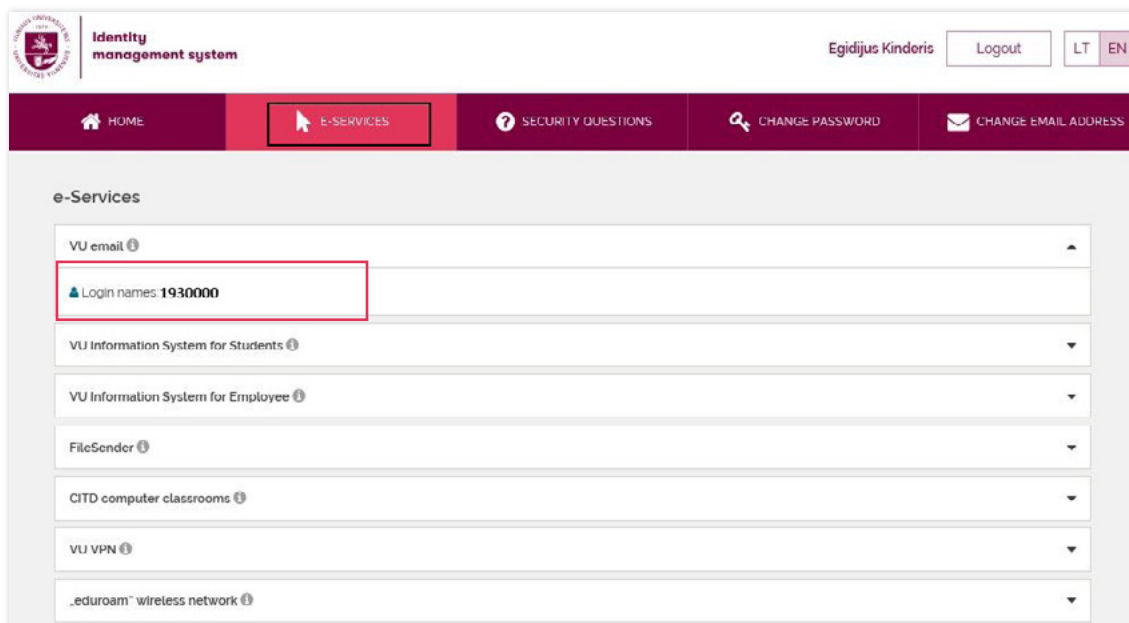
5. Click on **CONTINUE** and follow the instructions:

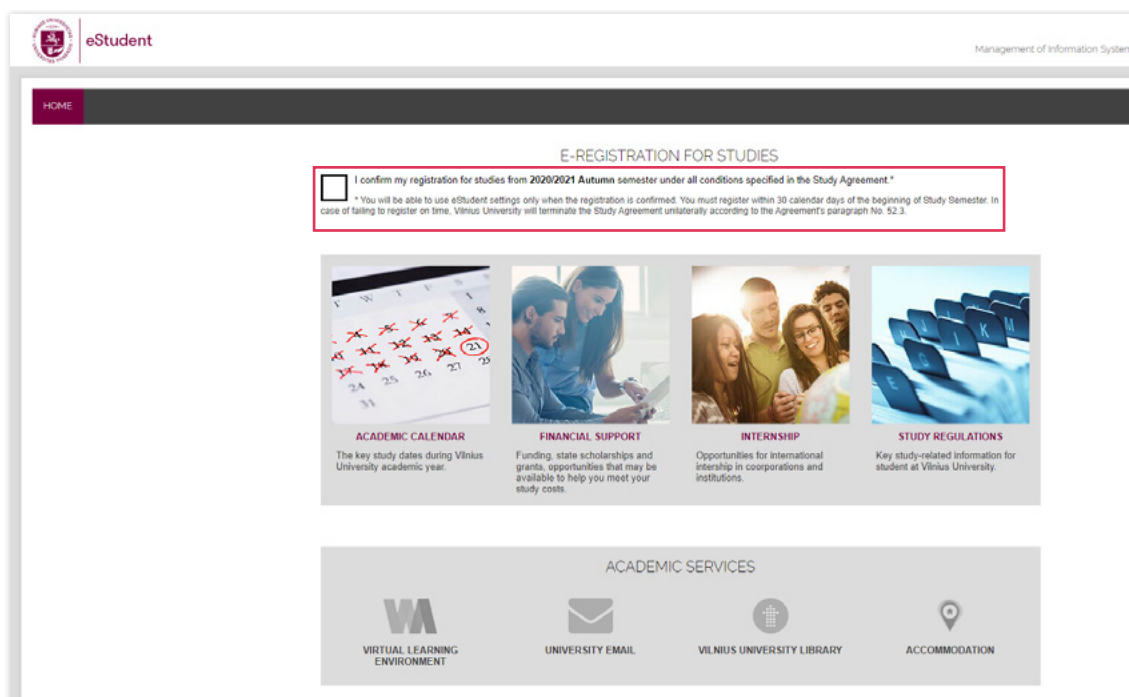


Also, you have to register yourself for studies via eStudent platform:

LITHUANIAN STUDENT CARD (LSP)

Full-time students coming to study at Vilnius University must obtain a **Lithuanian Student Card (LSP)**. This card provides discounts as well as proves the status of a student and it is used to enter Vilnius University Library and use its facilities.

1. **Degree students** should register at the website www.lsp.lt to order their Student Identity Card. Registration:



2. Once registration is complete, students get access to their accounts where they have to indicate their home University and upload their photo. The photo must be of a good quality, with white or light plain background, the face has to be seen fully and clearly. After the photo is uploaded, the student should wait for the approval.
3. When all these steps are completed, the link **ORDER A NEW LSIC** should appear in the section **MY LSIC**.

4. Having clicked on the link, students will be asked to select a bank (Swedbank or DnB) and a specific branch where they want to pick up the card. Date and time of the planned visit at the bank should also be indicated.

5. When the details of the LSIC pick up are selected, students will be asked to indicate their preference on the payment method. Two possibilities are available: online payment or payment at the selected bank branch (the latter option will include an additional bank service tax).

The LSIC/LSP prices are:

- EUR 12 for Bachelor degree students;
- EUR 6 for Master degree students;
- EUR 16 for Medicine and Odontology students;
- EUR 4,50 for one or two semesters of studies.

6. After LSIC order has been completed, students can follow the process of LSIC production on their account on www.lsp.lt.

What to do if I lost my card during the study period?

In case of loss you should:

- fill in the request form*;
- order a new LSIC.

In case of robbery you should:

- fill in the request form*;
- get the police record about the criminal offence;
- order a new LSIC.

* Request form can be found on the internet: please visit www.lsp.lt, section "About LSIC" (Documents) or go to any branch of Vilnius University Students' Representation. Filled in documents must be delivered to Vilnius University Students' Representation or they can be scanned and sent via e-mail to lsp@vusa.lt.

Once your studies at Vilnius University finish, please bring you LSIC to the nearest Vilnius University Students' Representation.
