Annotation of the course content
<p>The course is intended for PhD students in philology, cultural history, social history and social theory. Theoretical perspectives interpreting nationalism in different ways are reviewed. The diachronic interaction of literature, social structure and mentality in the context of the emergence and spread of national ideas and the formation of the modern nation-state is considered. The relationship between symbolic forms and social action and the cultural and historical genesis of collective identity are examined from the perspectives of ethnosymbolism, constructivism, Marxism, the Geneva School, New Historicism, and post-colonial criticism. Lithuanian literature from the late 18th century to the present day is analysed to uncover the hypothetical counter-influences: how the changes in national self-understanding are reflected in literary texts, and how these texts affect the transformation of identity. The types of identity reconstructed in Lithuanian literature and their development are compared with the cultural forms of Latvian, Polish, Czech, Hungarian and Irish nationalism. Based on literary material, comparative models of national identity in Russia, the Austro-Hungarian and British empires, Western and Central Europe, and the Soviet and post-Soviet periods are considered. The application of the most recent concepts within the history of ideas and aesthetics (socialist romanticism, cultural palimpsest, mimicry, euronovel, metamodernism) is demonstrated and applied to the analysis of Lithuanian literature and culture.</p>
