Course annotation
The course is dedicated to the analysis of ontological problems of Hegel's philosophy and their contemporary interpretations.
Hegel's „Science of Logic“ and his other works („Phenomenology of Spirit“) will be analyzed in lectures and seminars discussing Malabou's work „Future of Hegel“, in order to reveal not the formal aspect of Hegel's logic, but its ontological nature. The ontological nature of Hegel's logic will be attempt to reveal in the negative perspective of his thinking. For that purpose texts of the contemporary authors, such as Giorgio Agamben and Catherine Malabou, that interpret Hegel's philosophy and highlight its negative power, will be projected to Hegel's philosophy.
Auditory sesions will be held weekly.
Settlement requirements are related to the topic of the dissertation and are determined idividually.
32 hours are allocated for lectures, 16 hours for seminars.
