Conceptualization of traumatic stress, historical development of traumatic stress understanding, discussions about stressor criterion. Traumatic stress responses: clinical, theoretical and methodological challenges. Prediction of posttraumatic responses. Evidence from research.
Conceptualization and diagnostic criteria of posttraumatic stress disorder in DSM and ICD. Trauma reactions and posttraumatic symptoms theoretical conceptualization. Biopsychosocial approach, multimethod research.
Psychosocial support models and principles, social support, research on the effectiveness of psychological support, political and symbolic meanings of support, individual and group therapy. Specific traumas, violence, loss, effects of long-term traumatization.
