Course annotation

The concepts of *identity*, *identification*, *identity change* and conceptualization of identity in modern and postmodern social discourses. Metaphors and rhetoric questions as the forms of theoretical reflections on identity issues (e.g. Z.Bauman's metaphors of society, person, utopia). Social movements and identity politics in the second half of the 20-th century.

Theoretical and methodological variety of conceptualization of identity. Marxist perspective of identity and the links with psychoanalysis (e.g. H.Marcuse). Psychoanalytical perspective of identity (Z.Freud, E.Erikson, etc.). The influence of poststructuralism on conceptualization of identity (e.g. M.Foucault). Identity from the prism of cultural and linguistic studies (e.g. S.Hall, P.Du Gay). Understanding of identity in symbolic interactionism (e.g. E.Goffman's ideas about individual and social identity, A.L.Strauss about the ways of understanding identity issues, Sh.Stryker's notion of *identity salience*, R.Park's concept of *marginal man*). Person in the era of simulation (J. Baudrillard). A. Giddens ideas about modernity and identity.

The concept of *the other* in sociology: difference and othering (*the other* by gender, race, ethnicity, citizenship, sexuality). Stigmatization of *the other*. Global mobility and identity.

Gender issues of identity (from S.de Beauvoir to J.Butler); the ideas of feminism and masculinism; gay and lesbian as identities (e.g. M.Castells). Homophobia and sexism.

Self and *self-identity* in social theories. *We-ness* and collective identity (e.g. B.Anderson's ideas about social construction of nation; G. Delanty's ideas about social construction of Europe).

Virtual identity and identity construction through social media.

During consultation the additional and relevant to the PhD theses of the student literature can be suggested.

The assessment during the exam:

1. Written answers to two questions from the course unit description are evaluated (each constitutes 1/3 of the total evaluation).
2. A short essay written in free form during the exam about the identity problems raised in the student's doctoral theses (1/3 of the total evaluation) is evaluated.
