<p>The main objectives of the module:</p> <p>a) to develop students' conversational and comprehension skills in Italian (corresponding to level A2);</p> <p>b) to form a competence to analyze a number of model texts of Italian literature;</p> <p>c) to conceive of the impact of phenomenological and hermeneutical approaches on the European language education with a special focus on Italian literature;</p> <p>d) to gain understanding of the peculiarities of the development of Italian literature;</p> <p>e) to develop analytical and critical thinking.</p>
