Purpose of the course unit

The course provides students with a comprehensive introduction to the historical, cultural, and linguistic aspects of the Grand Duchy of Lithuania through the study of its textual heritage. Through lectures and weekly seminars, students will examine both the changes and continuity of the Grand Duchy of Lithuania's religious thought, culture, political and social relations, as well as book, print and literary histories. The focus on primary sources will allow the students to have a first-hand experience of the period, familiarize themselves with a wide range of literary and visual genres of the different periods. Students will gain historical and cultural understanding, develop skills in reading and analysing historical and literary texts, acquire cognitive and social competences of independent study and team work with other students and lecturer, including identifying relevant issues and exchanging of ideas.
