Purpose of the course unit

This is a course that provides the practical teaching of spoken Estonian: introduction to Estonian pronunciation, grammar, lexicology. Comprehension of written and oral texts, writing of various texts, comprehension of listening texts is taught. The structure of the Estonian language is introduced, learning to use different dictionaries of the Estonian language. Language skills are developed to level A2.
