The assignments will require the students to creatively approach problem questions related to Lithuanian social and political life. The students will be evaluated based on the quality of the content, creativity and the ability to work as a group.
Written assignment	40	Week 12	The students will have to write an academic essay on the topic of their choosing. The topics will need to be disscussed and confirmed with the lecturer by Week 9. The essay will be evaluated on the quality of the content, ability to adhere to academic requirements, structure and overall brilliance.
