## Purpose of the course unit (module): programme competences to be developed

This course is designed as an introduction to Belarus and Ukraine studies. This course is two cases study. The course deals with the historical forms of Belarusian and Ukrainian state and current political and economic system of Belarus and Ukraine. During the course the issues of the foreign policy, regional security, election system, economics and energy security are going to be analyzed.

During this course a set of generic competences will be developed, such as the ability to set an agenda for research and priorize various tasks, independently design a research on chosen topic, capacity to integrate different theories and analytical insights into coherent research and present the findings for specific audiences. Moreover, a set of subject specific competences will be developed, such as a key knowledge on the major concepts, theoretical perspectives and findings about the political and economic development of Ukraine and Belarus, will be able to evaluate ongoing social, political and economic processes in these countries and understand the problems related with their political identity formation.
